#### **School Achievements**

Gilbert Elementary School had a number of accomplishments during the 2020-2021 school year. Our multimillion-dollar renovation was completed this school year, along with a significant change to the configuration of our school. Formerly known as Gilbert Primary School with 4K-2<sup>nd</sup> grade, we added grades three through five and the name of our school changed to Gilbert Elementary.

Using Title I funds, we were able to provide each student at GES with an average of ten to twelve take-home books this school year. We also used Title I funds to implement our first Extended Day Program for identified students during the fourth quarter. The program provides sixty-eight students with intensive reading instruction over the course of twenty-four two-hour sessions.

We formed a partnership with the Teachers College in order to provide teachers with five days of targeted professional learning. We made progress on our AVID journey by engaging in a year-long planning process with our AVID District Director in anticipation of our first full year of implementation in 2021-2022.
