NATIONAL SCHOOL LUNCH PROGRAM

Our lunch program offers a variety of hot and cold entrées, along with fresh fruit and vegetables. Lunch includes an entrée of lean protein and whole grains, 2 servings of fruit, 2 servings of vegetables, and 1% white or skim chocolate milk.

SCHOOL BREAKFAST PROGRAM

Elementary schools have a breakfast kiosk service which allows students to take breakfast to their classrooms, while Middle and High school students will come through the serving



line in the cafeteria. Breakfast includes an entrée with whole grains and/or lean protein, fruit, 100% juice, and 1% white or skim chocolate milk.

WHY AREN'T MEALS FREE IN THE '22-'23 SCHOOL YEAR?

The USDA made it possible for school nutrition programs to serve all students breakfast and lunch, at no cost, through waivers during the 21-22 school year.

Congress did not extended these waivers for the upcoming school year, so we will go back to regularly priced meals.

This does not apply to schools that qualify for the breakfast in the classroom program. Those meals will continue at no cost. Please be sure to fill out a meal benefit application, which will be available July 19, 2022

MEAL BENEFIT APPLICATION

During the pandemic, the USDA knew a lot of people found themselves struggling financially. They did not want school food to be a concern for families, so they passed waivers allowing all students to have a free breakfast and lunch. As things are slowly getting back to "normal," Congress did not extend those waivers, so we will be returning back to regular priced meals. To see if you are eligible for Free or Reduced priced meals, be sure to fill out a meal benefit application, which will be available online beginning July 19, 2022.
