Rigorous Curriculum

RBHS offers a variety of challenging courses at levels including College Prep (CP), Honors, College Board Advanced Placement (AP), and Dual Enrollment (DE). CP courses are offered in all core subjects. There are sixty-eight (68) Honors level courses offered in English, Math, Science, Social Studies, World Language, Fine Arts, and Career and Technology. In addition, RBHS offers the following twenty-eight (28) AP courses: 2-D Art & Design, 3-D Art & Design, Art History, Biology, Calculus AB, Calculus BC, Chemistry, Chinese Language & Culture, Computer Science Principles, Drawing, English Language & Composition, English Literature & Composition, Environmental Science, French Language & Culture, German Language & Culture, Human Geography, Macroeconomics, Music Theory, Physics 1: Algebra-Based, Physics C: Electricity & Magnetism, Physics C: Mechanics, Psychology, Spanish Language & Culture, Statistics, Studio Art, United States Government & Politics, United States History, and World History. Students may choose to attend Lexington Technology Center and other high schools in the district with Centers for Advanced Study for additional career and technical course offerings as a part of their high school curriculum. Course levels are noted in course IDs and titles on the transcript. Attendance and Units (Credits)

One unit represents an academic standards-based course that requires a minimum of 120 hours of instruction. One-half unit of credit represents an academic standards-based course requiring a minimum of 60 hours of instruction. To earn credit in a yearlong course (180-day), a student must have a passing average and no more than 10 unexcused absences. For semester-long courses (90-days), a student must have no more than five unexcused absences. For quarter-long courses (45-days), a student must have no more than three unexcused absences.

South Carolina Uniform Grading Scale

The SC Board of Education has adopted a uniform grading policy for SC Public Schools which established weighting for class rank purposes. Information about the SC Uniform Grading Policy can be found at: www.ed.sc.gov. GPAs are calculated on a 4.0 weighted scale. SC transitioned to a 10-point Grade Scale in 2016-17. Prior year courses were evaluated on a 7-point Grade Scale (see below).

End-of-Course Examination Program (EOCEP)

The End-of-Course Examination Program (EOCEP) is a statewide assessment program of end-of-course tests for gateway courses awarded units of credit in English/language arts, mathematics, science, and social studies. EOCEP scores count as 20% of the final course grade. EOCEP test items are aligned to the South Carolina Academic Standards for each content area.
