Art Council


Art Council meets after school on **Wednesdays** in Mrs. Morris's room and is open to ANY student that wants to join, regardless of art experience. The group does community building and art-making activities such as "Eat Your Art Out" (food sculpture:), makes art for school spirit, uses art to collaborate with other school groups, and more!

National Art Honor Society (NAHS)

NAHS is a nationally chartered organization, and NAHS members meet after school on **Thursdays** with Mr. West and Ms. Hudson. They do many of the same types of activities as Art Council, but they will often work on different projects. Serious art students join NAHS because it looks good on college applications, and it gives you access to an exciting South Carolina NAHS conference / workshop in the Spring. NAHS students are also eligible to wear a distinctive set of cords with their graduation robe. To join NAHS, you must have completed at least one art class, maintain a B or better average in all art classes, and submit a small portfolio with a written application.

Eligible students can also be in both groups if desired, and membership in either group will give you access to to a fun field trip in the Spring. We haven't selected this year's destination, but past trips have included gallery walks, museum tours, and other fun activities in Charleston, Greenville, Myrtle Beach, and Asheville, NC. Also, whenever we have artists in from the community or colleges in to present information about art programs, both groups are invited to attend.




