A Day in the Life of Middle School

FINANCE

The finance team has been working closely with our financial advisors and bond attorney on the recently approved debt issuances. Part of that process is obtaining bond ratings from rating agencies. The press release for those ratings went out on August 22, 2023 and are summarized below: (Click on each link for the full press release)

- <u>S&P Global Ratings</u> assigned its 'AA' long-term rating and 'AA' underlying rating to Lexington County School District (SD) No. 1, S.C.'s series 2023B general obligation (GO) bonds in the amount of \$16.5 million. The outlook is stable.
- <u>Moody's Investors Service</u> has assigned Aa2 underlying and Aa1 enhanced ratings to Lexington County School District 1, SC's General Obligation Bonds, Series 2023B, which have a proposed par amount of roughly \$16.5 million. Moody's maintains Aa2 issuer and Aa3 lease appropriation ratings for the school district. The outlook is stable.

HUMAN RESOURCES

Kelly Services Update

In Spring, 2023 we began transitioning to Kelly Services for our substitutes 263 subs joined Kelly Services then. The Kelly list is now at 412 active substitutes. We continue to fine tune our work with them, but right now we are at a roughly 90% fill rate.

ParaPro Exam

Our instructional support staff employees are required to have one of these qualifications: 60 semester hours of accredited higher education **OR** an associate's degree (or higher) **OR** pass the ParaPro assessment. The Adult Education division has been partnering to administer the ParaPro exam to Lex 1 employees and also to many employees throughout the state. ParaPro charges employees \$55 per test. In an effort to further support <u>Lex One</u> employees, we are examining ways to reimburse them from this point forward if they need to take the parapro exam.

INSTRUCTIONAL SERVICES

<u>Erin's Law</u>

A board member requested additional information regarding the district's plan to comply with Erin's Law. When Erin's Law, (59-32-20(B)), passed in 2014, the district began implementing the required lessons. Elementary counselors have been teaching the 4K through 5th grade lessons since the start. Until this year, Erin's Law lessons were taught as part of the health curriculum for all secondary schools. We are revising middle school lessons plans. Middle school parents will receive notification when planning is completed and before lessons are implemented. Middle school counselors will teach grade level lessons annually. Beginning this year, Pathways to Healing personnel will provide the lessons to high school students in order to ensure HS students receive the lessons per statute. Erin's Law does not provide parents with an opt out option, but they may request to preview the curriculum. Each individual school sets the exact dates for lessons at each grade level.

Preschool Update

Currently, we have 405 students on our waiting list for our 4K programs. It is noteworthy that 130 of these students meet either Medicaid eligibility criteria or are at or below 185% of the federal poverty level, underlining the need for accessible preschool programs.

<u>SGES - 21st Century Community Learning Centers</u> <u>Grant</u>

Saxe Gotha Elementary was recently awarded a 4-year, \$469,533 21st Century Community Learning Centers (21st CCLC) after school program grant to serve 75 students in grades 2-5. School administrators and staff are focused on garnering improved outcomes for participants by implementing targeted instruction through a comprehensive literacy intervention program, as well as a research-based math program aligned to state math standards. The Lexington County Public Library and Lexington County Sheriff's Department are our proposed partners for the afterschool program, so that the school is well poised to serve the youth and their families in the Red Bank community.

House Bill 4122 directed DHEC to distribute certain life saving medications that school nurses and trained staff are authorized to use in schools. DHEC has provided naloxone (narcan) for each school in our district. We are awaiting their training guidelines and protocols before proceeding.
