Special Education School Visit

Several district leaders will visit Washington Center in Greenville County School District on Wednesday, September 27. Washington Center is a specialized school for students with significant cognitive disabilities. The specifically designed campus includes classrooms, a cafeteria, a student kitchen, a greenhouse, a gym, a library, therapy rooms, a multisensory suite, an adapted playground, a nature trail, and a nurse's station. All students are served by classroom teachers, as well as by instructors in the areas of Art, Music, Physical Education, Daily Living, Library, and Environmental Science. The staff also includes para-professionals, nurses, and therapists (occupational, physical, and speech). Board members are invited to attend the school visit.
