- Lexington District One remains one of the fastest-growing school districts in the state.
- Lexington District One originally budgeted for 200 new students in 2023–2024
- Even after building 19 new schools since 1997, the district still uses 165 portables across the district.
- World language is offered at all levels including elementary, middle and high schools.

Students

- Lexington District One's on-time graduation rate for 2022 was 88.1 percent.
- Lexington District One's 2023 high school graduates earned more than \$128.3 million in scholarships.
- Our students excel in state and national award-winning marching bands, symphonic bands, choral programs, strings programs and athletic programs.
- Lexington District One students perform well on nationally normed assessments (ACT, PSAT, SAT, MAP).

Staff

- The district currently has 4,085 employees (233 administrators, 2,283 certified employees, 1,401 support staff and 168 bus drivers).
- 71.2 percent of our teachers have master's degrees or above.
- Student to teacher ratio (core subject areas) in 5-Year-Old Kindergarten through Grade 2 is 21 to 1, Grade 3 through Grade 5 is 23 to 1, Grade 6 through Grade 8 is 23 to 1, and Grade 9 through Grade 12 varies depending on course.

Transportation — School Buses (2023–24)

- 189 route buses: AES 3; Gilbert 23; Lexington 43; Pelion 22; Special Needs 45; White Knoll 34; undesignated 28.
- Approximately 27k miles driven each school year by 184 bus drivers.
- The district transports about 15,000 students each day. The Field Trip hub does 3,000 field trip permits.
