District-level Title I personnel will work with schools to support effective parent and family engagement. Families will be encouraged to partner in the learning process and participate in parent/teacher conferences and school activities. Families will be involved in the decisions regarding how funds will support parent and family engagement.

Families will be given information regarding student progress, curriculum and state and local assessments.

Families will be given the opportunity to provide comments on the Title I Program Plan. Families will receive online access to annual school and district report cards. Multilingual learners will be tested if needed and the results will be shared with families.
