SCHOOL CURRICULUM

- Provide high-quality curriculum and instruction in a supportive, effective, and safe learning environment
- Progress monitor with formative assessments (part of daily instruction) and summative assessments (end of chapter tests, end of semester tests, projects, labs, and state tests) to support each student's yearly growth in reading and math.
- Assist all students in meeting their learning targets by providing academic and behavioral supports
- Provide parents reasonable access to staff through phone calls, voicemail, email, written notes and parent-teacher conferences at various times to accommodate parents
- Align curriculum to State Standards to support higher learning
- Provide enrichment through activities such as the after-school program, athletic participations, fine arts and clubs

WORK PLAN GOALS

- Increase the percentage of students who are progressing on-time with the requisite skills for success at their current grade levels.
 - The percentage of students meeting or exceeding stretch growth targets on i-Ready Reading will improve to 28% (Currently 26%).
 - The percentage of students meeting or exceeding stretch growth targets on i-Ready Math will improve to 27% (Currently 25%).
 - The percentage of students meeting or exceeding standard on SC READY ELA will improve to 32%. (Increase by 2 percentage point)
 - The percentage of students who meet or exceed standard on SC READY Math will improve to 16%. (Increase by 3 percentage points)
- Improve the conditions, systems and structures to ensure safety and facilitate healthy behavioral growth and mental wellness of students and staff.
 - Student attendance as evidenced by average daily attendance improving to 93% (Currently 91.4%).
 - Decrease 7th grade discipline referrals by 10%.
